## NCAA Tournament History

**MAAC Champions:** The Fairfield University softball team earned their NCAA Tournament berth after capturing the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) championship in New Rochelle, N.Y. The Stags won the MAAC title for the second time in three years, also grabbing the title in 2015 for their first-ever NCAA appearance. The Stags also won the conference championship in 1991 before the automatic bid was available.

**Sixth Seed:** Fairfield went straight through the winner's bracket with a 4-0 record to capture the 2017 MAAC Tournament title. The Stags became the first six-seed to win the MAAC tournament since the conference expanded the number of teams from four to six in 2014. The lowest seed to win the tournament since the six-team format was third-seeded Iona in 2014.

**Getting Here:** Fairfield's four-game winning streak in the MAAC tournament including wins over third-seeded Marist by a 5-3 score, followed by a 3-0 win over second seeded Siena. The Stags ended their championship run with a pair of wins over fifth-seeded Monmouth University, taking a 4-0 win in the semifinal round and a 2-0 victory in the championship round.

**Deja Vu:** The Stags beat Monmouth twice to win the 2017 title, the same team that Fairfield knocked off to win the 2015 championship. In 2015, the Stags had to come out of the loser's bracket to defeat Monmouth twice on the final day of the tournament. The Hawks have been to the MAAC championship game three straight years.

**No Hitter:** Junior Destinee Pallotto tossed a no-hitter in the championship game of the MAAC tournament, facing one more batter than the minimum. The right hander walked only one batter on a 3-2 pitch in the fourth inning. Pallotto put down Monmouth in order during the other six innings. The performance was Pallotto's first collegiate no-hitter.

**MAAC Honors:** Two Fairfield University student-athletes were named to the All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). Sophomore Courtney Hankins and freshman Amanda Ulzheimer both earned a berth on the All-MAAC second team, while Ulzheimer also collected a spot on the MAAC All-Rookie team. Hankins enters the tournament with a .327 batting average with a team-high 11 doubles and 34 RBI. Ulzheimer is the team's top hitter at .353 and also is the top hitting rookie in the MAAC. She ranks first among her teammates with 17 stolen bases (22 attempts).

**MAAC Honors II:** Five Fairfield student-athletes earned a spot on the 2017 MAAC All-Tournament team. Pitcher Destinee Pallotto was named the tournament most valuable player after registering a 4-0 record with three straight shutouts and a no-hitter in the tournament. Amanda Ulzheimer (.308 BA in the tourney), Tori Reed (.429 BA), Angelina McGuire (.417 BA) and Kristen Ball (.273 BA, 1 Save) also were placed on the team.

**In The Classroom:** Twelve Fairfield University student-athletes earned All-Academic honors from the MAAC. Kristen Ball (marketing), Makenna DiGuilio (biology), Courtney Hankins (psychology), Karisa Hugghen (business), Gianna Kinhofer (marketing), Alisha Marshall (nursing), Angelina McGuire (mathematics), Cynthia Meringer (mathematics), Tori Reed (psychology), Madison Roberts (mechanical engineering), Molly Roche (marketing), and Rachel Sieber (biochemistry) received the distinction for earning a cumulative GPA of 3.20 or higher.

**Welcome Home:** Fairfield assistant coach Stephanie Hill returns to her alma mater for the Baton Rouge Regional. Hill was an Easton All-American who served the Tigers as a team captain in 2006. She was also a two-time Academic All-American as well as a three-time Academic All-District student-athlete. She ended her career ranked in the top 10 in LSU history in home runs (fourth), putouts (fourth), slugging percentage (sixth), RBIs (seventh), fielding percentage (seventh), batting average (eighth), hits (eighth), and doubles (eighth).

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Danielle Tringali gained entry to 14 games with six of those games coming as the starting pitcher. Her last start was at Hartford (April 18) when she tossed three innings in a 5-3 win on the road. Her first collegiate win was as a starter when she went four innings against Columbia, scattering five hits and fanning two hitters in her four innings of work. Her best strikeout performance was in her first career start when she sent down six La Salle hitters in a 6-4 loss in late February. She recorded 15 of her 21 strikeouts as a starter. Her only MAAC appearance was against Siena during which she allowed five runs on three hits and five walks in 1.2 innings.

**Before Fairfield:** Danielle Tringali joins the Fairfield University softball program after graduating from HB Plant High School. During her time at HB Plant, Tringali developed into a top pitcher, posting impressive numbers throughout her career. She ended her four-year stay with 19 career wins, 222 strikeouts, and a career ERA of 2.18. For her efforts, Tringali collected All-Western Conference first-team accolades as well as All-Area first team honors. She achieved success in the classroom as well, earning membership in the National Honor Society, the National English Honor Society, and the National Mathematics Honor Society (Mu Alpha Theta).

## 2017 Notebook

**First Start:** Danielle Tringali picked up her first career start against La Salle University on February 25, pitching six innings and falling short by a 6-4 count. She posted a season-high six strikeouts in the game. Tringali's next longest outing was a four-inning stint against Columbia on April 5.

**On Strike:** Danielle Tringali averaged 5.5 strikeouts per seven innings pitched by fanning 21 hitters in 26.2 innings pitched. Tringali collected a strikeout in 11 of her 14 appearances, which included five games with two or more strikeouts. The only games in which she did not record a strikeout were UNC-Charlotte, FIU (first meeting), and Sacred Heart. In all three of those games, Tringali pitched less than an inning.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Angelina McGuire enjoyed the best start to a season that anyone could ask when she homered in her first at-bat as well as the team's first at-bat of the 2017 season. Her solo home run came against Robert Morris and was the team's only run in a 3-1 loss that day. She served as the leadoff hitter for the first three games of the season, going 3 for 8 in those contests. She did not return to the leadoff spot until April 23 during the Iona doubleheader, going 2 for 3 in the first game of the twin bill. Since her return to the top spot, she has 10 hits in 32 at-bats (.313) which gives her a .325 batting average as the team's number one hitter. McGuire is batting .296 heading into the NCAA tournament with a hit in 24 of her 42 appearances. Her 20 walks also make her a prime leadoff hitter, checking into the MAAC tournament with a .414 on-base percentage. McGuire also hit a home run against Marist and Monmouth, as the outfielder batted .296 against this year's MAAC tourney field (8 for 27).

**2016:** After going without a home run last season, Angelina McGuire led the team in 2016 with seven homers, just three off the school record set by Erin Frank in 2006. Her .331 batting average placed fourth among her teammates. The outfielder also recorded 21 extra base hits in 45 games, serving as the team's leader in triples (3), and home runs. She recorded four or more RBI in four games, highlighted by her 5-hit, 5-RBI performance against Northern Kentucky. She also picked up four RBI against Saint Peter's and Siena in conference play. She reached base in 37 of her 48 appearances in 2016, a stat aided by her 15 walks. McGuire had at least one hit in 28 games this year including 11 games with two or more hits. She enjoyed a nine-game hitting streak from March 11-29, hitting .531 during the stretch (17 of 32 with 13 RBI).

**2015:** Angelina McGuire worked her way into the starting lineup early in the season and ended up starting 30 of her 38 appearances in 2015. The outfielder spent most of her season in right field where she recorded 44 putouts in 45 chances. The freshman picked up an RBI in five games this season which included a two-RBI day against Hartford. She went 3 for 3 in that game and scored a run. McGuire showed a good eye at the plate, working out 15 walks which helped earn a .385 on-base percentage. She drew three base-on-balls against Illinois-Chicago which translated into three runs scored. McGuire enjoyed a strong season on the base paths, successfully stealing six bases in seven tries and scoring 17 runs. She put together a four-game hitting streak in back-to-back double-headers against Siena and Quinnipiac, batting .417 during the stretch (5 of 12) with three runs scored

## Notebook

**Game Winner:** Angelina McGuire provided the game's only run in a 1-0 win over Monmouth University, a 13-inning game that took place during the regular season. She led off the 13th frame with a solo home run, the second time that she led off an inning with a homer in 2017. She also accomplished the task when she led off the game and season with a solo shot against Robert Morris in the opener.

**Lead Off:** Angelina McGuire has really taken to her role as the team's lead off hitter since returning to the role 11 games ago. The junior led off the Fairfield first inning by getting on base in five of the last 11 games with four singles and a hit by pitch. During this 11-game run, McGuire is batting .313 with 10 hits in 32 at-bats.

**On Base:** Angelina McGuire has walked seven times in the last 11 games which raised her team-leading total to 20 base-on-balls. She has posted 54 walks in her career with this year's total representing a personal best.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Hannah Futo was one of the team's primary pinch hitters, serving in that role for 16 of her 24 appearances this year. Her last start came against Sacred Heart on April 20 during which she went 1 for 3 with three RBI, a bases-clearing single to right center field. Her other RBI on the season was in her second career at-bat as she stroked an RBI double against UNC-Charlotte on February 25. She made it back-to-back games with a base hit when she followed the Charlotte game with a base hit and run scored versus Robert Morris in the same tournament. When in the field, Futo spent most of her time at third base although she did have a couple of stints at shortstop.

**Before Fairfield:** Hannah Futo begins her career as a Fairfield University student-athlete after graduating from Montverde Academy in Florida. The infielder enjoyed success but academically and athletically during her four years at the Academy. She finished her career as a hitter with a .342 batting average with four career home runs and 82 RBI. She registered 116 career hits during her four seasons with the program. Futo was a two-time team offensive most valuable player and served her team as captain during the 2016 campaign. She earned All-District honors as she helped the team capture the 2013 3A District title as well as the 2014, 2015, and 2016 4A District championships. In the classroom, Futo was a member of the National Honor Society, the National Society of High School Scholars, as well as the National Spanish Honor Society. She earned the school's Citizenship Award multiple times over her four years.

## 2017 Notebook

**Three For One:** Hannah Futo picked up three of her four RBI this season with one swing of the bat, stroking a three-run single against Sacred Heart that allowed Fairfield to avoid the eight-run rule. Trailing 11-1 in the sixth inning, the Stags rallied for three runs in the inning to keep the game going courtesy of Futo's drive to right center field. The Stags tacked on one run in the seventh before falling 11-5.

**Two For Three:** Hannah Futo's first three plate appearances for Fairfield came as a pinch hitter. And, the rookie responded with two hits in those at-bats. After being retired against La Salle, Futo responded with a base hit at UNC-Charlotte and versus Robert Morris. Her first career hit in the UNC-Charlotte game was a double that chased home a run as well. Futo also scored following those two hits.

**Versatility:** Hannah Futo contributed at three different positions on the lineup card this season, namely shortstop, third base, and designated player. She spent six games at third base, including a pair of starts, and four games at shortstop. She served as the team's designated player in three contests.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Marshall has negotiated her way through the batting order this year, spending time at the leadoff spot as well as the number two and eight positions in the order. She spent the last nine games of the regular season as the team's number eight hitter and performed well at the role, stroking seven hits in 19 at-bats for a .368 batting average during that time. She ended the regular-season with a four-game hitting streak that saw her record seven hits in 10 at-bats with three of her seven RBI on the season coming during the stretch. She owned a season-high five-game hitting streak from March 11 to 14, picking up six hits in 13 at-bats (.462). Marshall registered at least one hit in 19 games with five of those contests being two-hit outings. Marshall did not get a hit in against any of the four MAAC tournament games, going 0 for 9 in those dates. She led the team in sacrifice bunts with 11 and added two sacrifice flies.

**2016:** Alisha Marshall appeared in more games than any other Fairfield freshman in 2016, finishing with 42 appearances. She stood fifth on the team with a .330 batting average and her 30 hits were also best among the Stags' Class of 2019. She served both as a designated player and middle infielder, gaining 13 starts as the designated player, 16 at second base, and two at shortstop. After going hitless in first two games, an at-bat against both Georgetown and Butler, Marshall established a season-best five-game hitting streak which started with a 2 for 2 performance against North Carolina. She batted .667 on that five-game run (10 of 15) with four multi-hit contests. She had three doubles in 2016, two coming in a double-header against Rider University. Marshall had the dubious honor of leading the team with nine hit-by-pitch plate appearances this season.

**One For The Team** Alisha Marshall posted a team-high 11 sacrifice bunts this season, the only Stag to reach double figures in that category. The infielder also led the team by being hit with a pitch seven times. She just missed taking the top spot in walks as well, as her 19 are one shy of leader Angelina McGuire. All in all, Marshall had 37 plate appearances that did not register an at-bat which translates into 35 percent of her total plate appearances.

**Double Dip:** Alisha Marshall recorded two hits in five different games this season, but three of those came during a four-game hitting streak late in the season. On the weekend of May 6-7, Marshall hit in all four games with seven hits in 10 at-bats plus one walk. The sophomore had one longer hitting streak which came in March, a five-gamer that started with FIU on March 11 (6 for 13).

**Defense:** Alisha Marshall ranks among the top players on the team with 105 putouts and 58 assists. Her putout total trails only first basemen Courtney Hankins (212) and Kristen Ball (113) as well as catcher Tori Reed (80). Her assist mark is second to shortstop Rachel Sieber (108).

## Career Highlights

The freshman earned her first win as a Stag with a her final regular-season appearances against Sacred Heart on April 19, tossing 1.2 inning and allowing two unearned runs and one hit against the Pioneers. Roberts did not pitch against a MAAC opponent in 2016, seeing action against Butler, Bowling Green, Providence, Yale, Wagner, and Sacred Heart. Her season high for strikeouts stood at two, accomplished against Bowling Green and Wagner. Four of the six games in which she pitched were decided by one run and the other two appearances were two-run games.

**Against The Field:** Madison Roberts pitched against one team in this year's NCAA tournament field, facing FIU in her third outing of the season. She tossed four innings, her longest outing of the year, and allowed two earned runs and seven hits in the team's 10-3 loss. She nearly equaled that length with 3.2 innings of work against Hartford, earning her only win of the season.

**Save Opportunity:** Madison Roberts collected her first collegiate save when she tossed the final three innings of a 4-2 win over Columbia on April 5, allowing just one hit and one walk against one strikeout during her time in the circle. The effort included the least amount of hits she allowed in games which she pitched more than one inning.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** DiGuilio served her teammates as an outfielder, a designated hitter, and a pinch hitter during the 2017 campaign. She earned a start 18 times out of her 45 appearances and registered at least one hit in nine of those games. In her starts, DiGuilio batted .238 as a starter this year with 12 hits in 51 at-bats, the same as she hit off the bench (5 of 21 - .238). She had a three-game streak of driving in a run early in the year, picking an RBI against Robert Morris, George Mason, and Army. She had one game with two RBI, hitting the mark against Bethune-Cookman. She collected two triples during the year which came in consecutive games – Colgate and Bethune-Cookman. DiGuilio was often used a late-game defensive replacement, especially in right field. She played flawlessly in the field with 30 putouts and one assist against no errors. She batted .217 against the MAAC tournament field with five hits in 17 at-bats.

**2016:** Makenna DiGuilio spent time between being an outfielder, a pinch runner, and a designated player in 2016, gaining time in the field nine times. She gained entry into games mostly as a pinch runner and excelled at the task with eight runs scored in her 22 appearances. DiGuilio collected two of her three at-bats in back-to-back appearances against Western Michigan and North Dakota, but went hitless in those two plate appearances. She picked up her only hit of the regular season when she stroked a single at Rhode Island on April 27. She played in both ends of the Iona doubleheader, scoring one run in the team's 8-2 victory in the night-cap. DiGuilio also garnered one plate appearance against Yale which turned into a walk and enabled her to score later in the inning.

**2015:** Makenna DiGuilio appeared in 30 games as a freshman, contributing primarily as an outfielder and as a pinch runner. Her last game came against USC-Upstate during the NCAA tournament, appearing as a pinch runner. She started two games and batted .400 in those games (2 of 5) with an RBI. She batted .250 when coming off the bench (2 of 8) with an RBI. Her starts came against Saint Peter's and Stony Brook, both as an outfielder. **Late Game Defense:** Down the stretch, Head Coach Julie Brzezinski has utilized Makenna DiGuilio as a late-game defensive replacement, often sending the junior to right field in those situations. She played that role in the final six MAAC games, playing both ends of doubleheaders against Manhattan, Saint Peter's, and Quinnipiac. ## Career Highlights

**2017:** Amanda Ulzheimer earned a spot on the All-MAAC second team and the MAAC All-Rookie team, the only freshman to earn a spot on both squads. She has led Fairfield in hitting for most of the year and stands a top of the statistical sheet with a .353 batting average. The rookie places eighth in the MAAC for batting average and leads all conference freshmen in that category. She is also the team leader with 17 stolen bases (22 attempts) as well as runs scored (37). She earned the MAAC Rookie of the Week on March 7 after batting .667 (8 for 12) and owning a .750 on-base percentage in her four starts that week. Ulzheimer did not start the first three games of the season, but ended the year with 45 consecutive starts. After serving a pinch-runner without an at-bat in her first two games, she came back with an eight-game hitting streak (14 for 24 - .583). She went hitless against Florida International but started another eight-game hitting streak one game later (13 for 29 - .448). The outfielder put together 16 multiple hit games in the regular season. On the base paths, Ulzheimer has 16 stolen bases and ranks fifth in the MAAC with 0.33 stolen bases per game.

**Before Fairfield:** Amanda Ulzheimer comes to Fairfield after a successful scholastic career at H. Frank Carey High School where she excelled in the classroom and on the diamond. As a member of the softball team, Ulzheimer batted better than .500 for her career including an impressive .537 mark as a senior. ## Career Highlights

**2017:** Roche spent most of the season as the team's designated pinch hitter before moving into the starting designated player role late in the campaign. Seven of her eight starts came over the team's final 13 games, including the final four games of the regular season. In those four games, Roche batted .400 with four hits in 10 at-bats including a double in the opener against Saint Peter's. She picked up at least one hit in seven of her final 12 appearances and batted .409 during the stretch with nine hits in 22 at-bats. She had a team-high three pinch-hits (in 10 at-bats), ranking second with a .300 average as a pinch hitter. All three of her pinch hits came against MAAC opponents. She batted .250 during the MAAC tournament with two of her four hits clearing the left-center field fence. She posted four home runs during the season, the first coming against Butler. ## Career Highlights

**2017:** Kristen Ball spent most of the season on the right side of the infield as a second baseman before moving over the first base. When injuries struck the pitching staff, Ball moved the pitching circle for the first time as a collegiate, last pitching during her scholastic days. In her first game as a college pitcher, she earned a save in the first game of the MAAC tournament by pitching the seventh inning, the only inning out of 28 that someone other than Destinee Pallotto pitched. Ball also earned the save in the team's victory against Army, tossing one inning without allowing a base runner. She would go on to pitch in eight more games during the regular season. She had two starts in 2017, a five-inning loss to Monmouth and another five-inning stint in a loss to Iona. All of her 11 earned runs came in three outings – at Monmouth (four ERs), Sacred Heart (four ERs), and Iona (3 ERs). She enters the NCAA tournament with a 2-2 record and 2 saves with a 3.61 ERA in her 10 appearances. As a hitter, Ball ended the regular season by hitting in five of six games (6 for 16 - .375) with two doubles and two home runs along with seven RBI. Ball batted .273 during the 2017 MAAC tournament and earned a spot on the All-Tournament team.

**2016:** Kristen Ball spent time as the team's starting shortstop for 25 games before moving over to second base for five games and to designated player for a pair of games. In all, the infielder started 31 games and batted .245 through the season. She put together a pair of four-game hitting streaks during the season, the first coming on March 5-6 during which she stroked four hits in 11 at-bats. She also strung together four consecutive games with a hit from March 11-16, batting .529 (9 of 17) with two doubles and four RBI. After that four-game run, the infielder owned a .350 batting average which was the highest point of the season. Ball showed her power capabilities with a home run against Northern Kentucky and Holy Cross, both in neutral settings. She recorded a hit in 18 games this year, including five multi-hit games that were highlighted by her four-hit effort against North Dakota.

**2015:** Kristen Ball raised her batting average with a strong showing at the MAAC tournament, finishing with a .192 hitting percentage. She picked up 15 hits, two HBP, and nine walks to reach base 26 times that year. The infielder had three extra base hits, all of which were triples and came over nine games (May 2-8). She is the team leader in wins with 13 and saves with 2 in addition to posting a team-best with 99 strikeouts in her 30 appearances. Pallotto tossed a 12-inning complete game shutout against Monmouth on April 14 as the Stags won by a 1-0 count. She scattered seven hits and fanned a season-high nine batters in the game.

**2016:** Destinee Pallotto picked up where she left off a year ago with 10 wins in her sophomore season. Pallotto has thrown more innings (146.0) and recorded more strikeouts (136) than any other Fairfield pitcher this season. Her 10 wins are the most she has recorded in a season with the Stags, surpassing her nine victories in 2015. She averaged six strikeouts per MAAC outing this year (66 in 11 appearances), including a season-best 12 in a five-inning victory against Saint Peter's. ## Career Highlights

**2017:** Cynthia Meringer started six of her first seven appearances as an outfielder before becoming one of the first off the bench for the Stags for the remainder of the season. Three of her four hits this season came as a starter, including a base hit in the season opener against Robert Morris. She picked up an extra base hit and an RBI in the team's match up with Columbia on March 4 and followed up with another hit and an RBI in her next start, a single versus George Mason. After spending time in the outfield during her first 12 games in the field, she has played almost exclusively as a first baseman in April in May (five appearances).

**2016:** Cynthia Meringer came off the bench in 14 of her appearances, getting the nod as a pinch hitter in most of those games. She picked up an RBI in her first collegiate game against Butler, one of three RBI this season. She also picked up an RBI in her last regular-season appearances, a run-scoring single in the second Iona game. Her other RBI was the result of being hit by a pitch with the bases loaded at Rhode Island. The rookie picked up three base hits during the year, a single against Army, Wagner, and Iona. Meringer made five appearances in the field, all coming as an outfielder. She posted three putouts and no assists without an error in those games.

**Before Fairfield:** Cynthia Meringer joins the Fairfield University softball program in 2016 after spending her scholastic career at Randolph High School in New Jersey. The infielder enjoyed a great deal of success during her softball career, finishing her four-year stay with a .503 batting average with 125 hits, eight home runs and 55 RBI. As a senior, Meringer registered a .387 batting average with 20 RBI. She was a first-team All-Conference selection and also collected a berth to the All-County first team. In the classroom, Meringer was an honor roll student each semester at Randolph High School.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Reed provided the Stags with a portion of its power numbers this year with a team-high five home runs. She leads the team with 18 extra base hits, including two triples and a home run in the MAAC tournament. Reed earned a spot on the MAAC All-Tournament team after leading the team with a .429 average (6 of 14) with two triples, a homer, and a team-best five RBI. She ended the regular-season with a four-game hitting streak, stroking six hits in 12 at-bats with seven RBI and four doubles during the run. Earlier in the season, Reed recorded a 10-game hitting streak that ran from February 24 to March 11. After going hitless against Illinois State to end the streak, she came back with a nine-gamer that lasted between March 13 and March 19. Having hit in 19 of 20 games, Reed batted .400 during those streaks (28 hits in 70 at-bats). The catcher posted an RBI in 19 games this season, recording two or more RBI 11 times.

**2016:** Reed stood out at the plate as well as behind it as the team's starting catcher. The junior posted her second straight .300-plus season after batting .355 a year ago. Reed leads the team with 13 doubles, while her 16 extra-base hits were second on the squad. The junior started 44 games behind the plate and six games as the team's designated player. She averaged nearly a hit per game with 49 in 50 contests. Reed started the season with a nine-game hitting streak, stroking 13 hits in 32 at-bats (.406) with seven RBI, three doubles, and one home run. Her next best streak came at the end of the season when she hit in four straight contests before going hitless in the first game of the Iona doubleheader. Over the final six games of the regular season, Reed batted .500 with eight hits in 16 at-bats. Reed did not commit an error during the season with 229 putouts and 14 assists.

**2015:** Reed ended the year as the team's second-leading hitter with a .355 batting average in her 46 starts. Reed was one of two Fairfield student-athletes with more walks than strikeouts, posting 16 base-on-balls with 14 strikeouts. Her .415 on-base percentage was also second on the team while her .558 slugging percentage was tops on the team. She led the Stags with 15 extra-base hits, registering eight doubles and six home runs. Reed posted a 12-game hitting streak late in the season, starting on April 11 vs. Saint Peter's through the first game at Marist on April 26. The catcher batted .357 during the streak with 15 hits in 42 at-bats. Reed registered an RBI in 20 games and a hit in 36 of 44 games played. The sophomore also had a 10-game hitting streak earlier in the year. Reed enjoyed success in MAAC regular-season play, hitting .394 with four doubles, a triple, and a homer with 15 RBI in 20 starts.

**2014:** Tori Reed broke into the lineup early this year, gaining her first action with the Stags as a designated player. She finished the season with a .284 batting average, stroking 27 hits in 40 appearances. Reed began platooning with Lauren Liseth behind the plate midway through the year. Reed had six extra base hits with five doubles and one home run. She was one of three Fairfield players to have more walks (16) than strikeouts (7) during the year. She was among the team leaders with a .391 on-base percentage, placing fourth overall. Reed hit her first collegiate home run against Kansas as part of the Kentucky tournament. Her two-run homer helped her record her first collegiate RBI as well. Reed was a perfect three for three in the stolen base department this year, all of which came in consecutive games (one vs. Iona and two vs. Saint Peter's).

**Non-Conference Success:** Tori Reed enjoyed more success against non-conference opponents than any other Stag, accounting for four of the team's eight home runs in those 28 games. Reed also led the team with eight extra base hits including four doubles and 19 RBI. She had at least one hit in 21 of the team's 27 non-conference games including seven games with two or more hits.

**Defensive Effort:** Tori Reed made an error in the first game of the season but has not had a miscue since the opener, cleanly fielding 190 chances in a row. Reed was perfect in MAAC play with 80 putouts and four assists in 20 conference games.

**Game Winner:** If anything good can come of a strikeout, Tori Reed found out just how. The senior struck out for the first time in the conference tournament during the title game, but it still produced the winning run. After swinging and missing at a ball in the dirt, the ball squirted past the catcher which allowed Reed to reach first base and let Rachel Sieber score from first base, giving Fairfield a 1-0 lead.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Hughen emerged as one of the dependable arms for the Stags through the first half of the year before having to go on the disabled list for three weeks. In February and March, the right hander surrendered five or more earned runs in six of her 14 appearances. In April and May, she yielded five or more earned runs in one of her eight appearances. Hughen closed out the regular season with a 2-1 mark over her final three games including a pair of wins on the final regular-season weekend (Saint Peter's and Quinnipiac). Hughen adapted well to her new role as a starter after leading the team with four saves as a primary reliever in 2016. Hughen fanned 44 batters in 111 innings of work, both of which place second on the team.

**2016:** Hughen quickly adapted to her role out of the bullpen this year with 11 of her 16 appearances coming as a reliever. She picked up four saves in those 11 relief appearances which enabled her to place 26th in the nation for saves. The righty earned saves against Bethune-Cookman, Rider, and two versus Sacred Heart. She did not allow a run in half of her 16 games pitched, one of which was a shutout against Rhode Island. Hughen allowed just two hits and fanned two in the 10-0 victory against the Rams. She also collected a complete-game win against Wagner on April 13, yielding one earned run and nine hits while striking out five without walking a batter. Her 39-plus innings pitched are third among her teammates and the most by any Fairfield underclassman.

**Before Fairfield:** Karisa Hughen was a key member of the Rancho Buena Vista High School softball team throughout her career. During that time frame, the pitcher posted a 2.52 ERA with 19 wins and 134 strikeouts in 174 innings pitched. In her sophomore season, Hughen earned a 14-6 record in 25 appearances, fanning 102 batters in 124 innings pitched. As a junior, Hughen posted 32 strikeouts in 50 innings of work and earned a 5-2 overall record. A control pitcher, she registered more strikeouts than walks in her sophomore and junior seasons. In addition to her high school performance, Hughen also was a member of the American Athletics Gold travel team. She earned a spot on the academic honor roll each semester and was an AP scholar.

**On The Rebound:** Karisa Hughen started the year with a 1-9 record but rebounded with five straight winning decisions before going on the disabled list for three weeks. The last of those five victories came against Marist College against which she tossed seven innings and allowed one earned run in the 4-1 win.

**In The MAAC:** Karisa Hughen posted a staff-best five wins against MAAC opponents this season, ending the 20-game campaign with a 5-2 record in her seven starts. She is the only Fairfield starter to own a winning record in MAAC play and also led the team with two shutouts. Hughen's 1.99 ERA was just off Destinee Pallotto's team-leading 1.96 ERA in conference play.

**Scoreless Streak:** Karisa Hughen threw 20 consecutive scoreless innings which included back-to-back complete game shutouts. After surrendering a run in the final inning of the Sacred Heart game on March 30, Hughen tossed shutouts on consecutive days against Niagara and Canisius. She followed up with four scoreless innings against Columbia before seeing the streak end in the third inning at Marist.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** For the second straight season, Hankins put together an offensive showcase that had her leading the team in several statistical categories including doubles (11) and RBI (34). Over the final 10 games of the regular-season, Hankins batted .469 (15 for 32) with six doubles and 17 RBI. After not driving in a run through her first 12 appearances, she registered a hit in 31 of her 51 appearances with nine of those hitless appearances coming in the first 12 games of the season. She ranked fourth among her teammates with a .381 on-base percentage, a number helped by her 13 walks. Hankins led all Stags with 26 RBI against MAAC opponents this year, averaging 1.3 RBI per conference game.

**2016:** Hankins emerged as one of the team's top offensive players right from the start and remained the team's top run producer with a team-best 39 RBI and 22 runs scored. The infielder garnered a MAAC All-Rookie spot for her performance in 2016. She picked up the MAAC Rookie of the Week on March 22 after batting .500 with two home runs and seven RBI in a 2-1 week for the Stags. The infielder recorded a 13-game hitting streak from April 8-21 during which she batted .400 with 16 hits in 40 at-bats, registering four games with two or more hits. She has 15 extra-base hits which ties her for third among her teammates, recording 11 doubles and four home runs. Hankins hit three of those homers in a span of four games, launching the long ball against Stony Brook, Holy Cross, and Army. Hankins has a hit in 34 games this year and an RBI in 23 contests. Her best overall game came against Stony Brook when she went 2 for 5 with five RBI, a double and a home run.

**Before Fairfield:** Courtney Hankins enjoyed success at two different positions during her time at Pennsville High School in 2014, Hankins was named the Salem/Cumberland Country Softball Player of the Year in her first season as a catcher. She finished the year with a .624 batting average with 14 extra-base hits, two homers, and 38 RBI with 40 runs scored. In her sophomore season, Hankins posted a .476 hitting percentage with five home runs, 16 extra base hits (11 doubles, five homers) with 21 RBI. Hankins ended her career with 180 hits, 22 home runs, and a .553 batting average. The catcher set school records for most hits in a season as well as in a career. She also plays for the Newtown (Pa.) Rock Gold travel team.

**MAAC Player of the Week:** Courtney Hankins capped the regular season by earning the MAAC Player of the Week (May 1-7) after batting .545 with 10 RBI in a 3-1 week for the Stags. The sophomore had an RBI in all four games played during the week including seven in the Quinnipiac doubleheader. Hankins registered five hits in seven at-bats with seven RBI against Quinnipiac after driving home three runs in the Saint Peter's doubleheader.

**Position Change:** Courtney Hankins started the year as the team's primary first baseman but moved to the third base position almost exclusively during the Columbia doubleheader (April 5). Since the Columbia date, Hankins started 19 games at third base, three games at first base, and one contest behind the plate. Before April 5, Hankins posted 19 starts at first base and six starts at third base.

## Career Highlights

**2017:** Robinson played in 30 games as a third baseman, catcher, and designated player during the regular season. Of those 30 games, 12 of her appearances came against MAAC opponents. She batted .250 against MAAC opponents (4 for 16) and .250 against the MAAC tournament field (1 for 4). Her best day at the plate in 2017 came in the Rider double-header when she recorded a pair of hits in four at-bats with three RBI and a double. Robinson also picked up a double against Bethune-Cookman, accounting for her two extra base hits on the season. She was also adept at getting on base via the walk, picking up nine base on balls which translated into a .295 on-base percentage.

**2016:** Robinson appeared in all 50 games during the season, one of six Stags to earn the distinction. She tied for second on the team with four home runs, three of which came against non-conference opponents (Bethune-Cookman, Wagner, and Holy Cross). Her lone MAAC home run was against Saint Peter's. Robinson collected a hit in 25 of her 47 appearances, six of which were multi-hit contests. She registered three hits against Northern Kentucky and Holy Cross. The sophomore started the season strongly by securing a hit in eight of the first nine regular season games. She batted .339 during those opening nine contest (9 of 27) with six RBI and a double. Robinson led the team with 25 walks, putting her on base 58 times (33 hits) during the regular season.

**2015:** Kate Robinson was a member of the 2014 MAAC All-Rookie team. She ranked as the team's top hitting freshman all season long, contributing as a designated player, a catcher, and a third baseman. The rookie placed third on the team with 29 RBI and owned a .504 slugging percentage with a .397 on-base percentage. **Head Coach Julie Brzezinski**



Julie Brzezinski is in her 20th season as Fairfield University's head softball coach, having taken over the program in the spring of 1998. She enters the NCAA tournament with a career record of 794-702-5. During her 19 years at the helm, the Stags averaged 28 wins per season, advanced to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference tournament 18 times, and posted 12 winning campaigns. In 2015, she led Fairfield to its second MAAC championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament bid. before capturing the 2017 title and NCAA bid.

The Stags captured the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular-season title in six of the last 12 seasons. She was named MAAC coach of the year in 2011, the third time she collected that honor (2002, 2004).

The New Jersey native is the fifth head coach in Fairfield University softball history. Before her arrival, the school record for wins in a season was 29, a total she has equaled or surpassed nine times in 20 campaigns. Brzezinski owns a 549-507-5 record at Fairfield, heading into 2017 NCAA Tournament play. She earned her 300th Fairfield victory in a win against Siena during the 2008 season (April 5) and her 400th victory against Youngstown State.

Overall, her 600th career win came at home against Siena during the 2010 season. Her 500th career win was against Long Island University in March, 2006. Her 400th win came against Bucknell, a 7-2 decision during the team's Florida trip in the 2003 season. Brzezinski's 300th career win came in the 2000 regular-season finale, a 2-1 victory over Princeton.

Brzezinski came to Fairfield with eight years experience, coaching at Campbell University in North Carolina. Brzezinski led the Fighting Camels to two Big South Conference championships (1993 and 1994), one Trans Atlantic Conference title (1995), and one TAAC runner-up finish (1996). Campbell advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament during her tenure. She registered a 245-195 record in her eight years

Brzezinski graduated from Furman University in 1989, earning a bachelor of arts degree in business administration. She received her master's of education from Campbell in 1992. She played softball for four seasons while at Furman.
